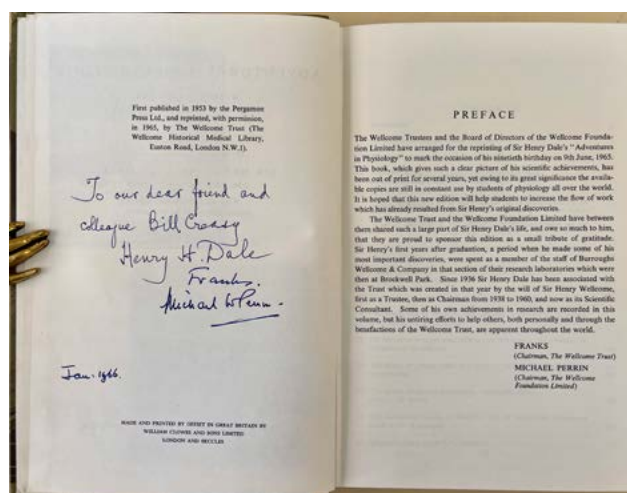
First edition, second issue of Cushing's first book, the first clinical monograph on the pituitary. Based upon a detailed study of fifty cases, Cushing's book described the clinical manifestations of pituitary disorder (gigantism, dwarfism, acromelagy, blindness, etc.), elaborating on the concepts of hyper-and hypopituitarism that Cushing had introduced four years earlier in his paper "The hypophysis cerebri." The case histories include the first report of pituitary basophilism ("Cushing's syndrome"), and the book also contains the first publication of Cushing's method for operating on the pituitary. *Bibliography of the Writings of Harvey Cushing*, 1. 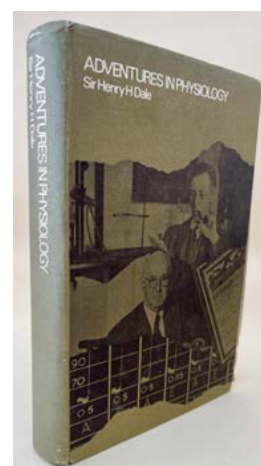

"After many experiments on the action of synthetic drugs upon spirochetal diseases, Ehrlich and Hata in 1909 discovered Arspenamine (Salvarsan, 'the arsenic that saves', also known as '606'), an effective treatment for syphilis and trypanosomiasis. Arspenamine was the first modern chemotherapeutic agent.

"Manufactured by the German chemical company Hoechst, Salvarsan quickly became the most widely prescribed drug in the world. It was the first blockbuster drug, and remained the most effective drug for syphilis until penicillin became available in the 1940s" (Garrison-Morton.com). (48847)

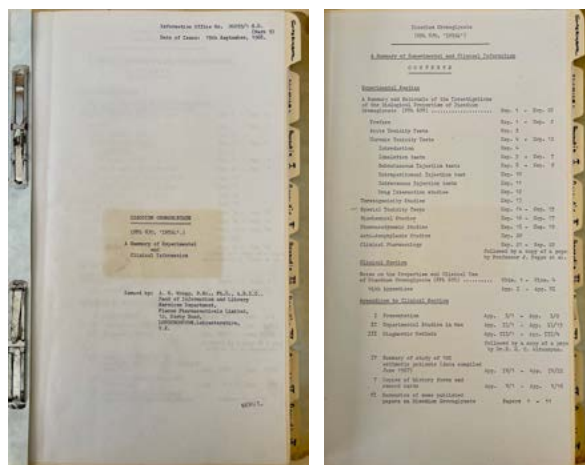

“Floyer provided the first clear descriptions of cases of bronchial asthma. Floyer himself suffered from asthma for over 30 years. He recognized the influence of heredity in asthma. The above includes (p. 239) an important early account of emphysema, from a post mortem on a broken-winded horse” (Garrison-Morton.com). Floyer posited correctly that spasmodic asthma was due in part to constriction of the bronchi. He is also known for being the first physician to count the pulse with the aid of a watch and to make regular observations on the pulse-rate, inventing a special watch for the purpose (see Garrison-Morton.com 2670). 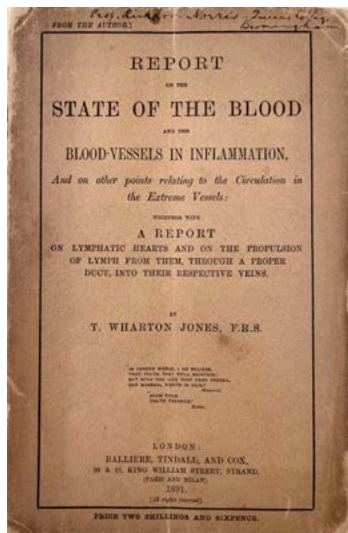

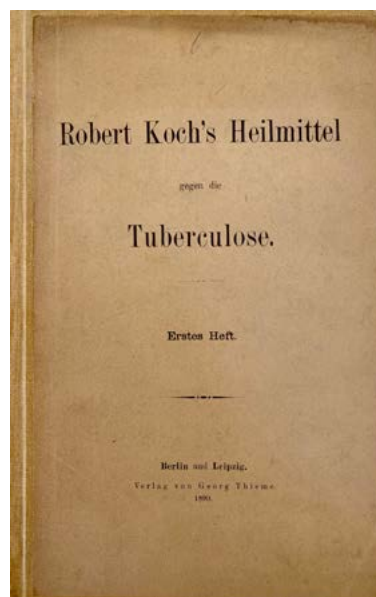

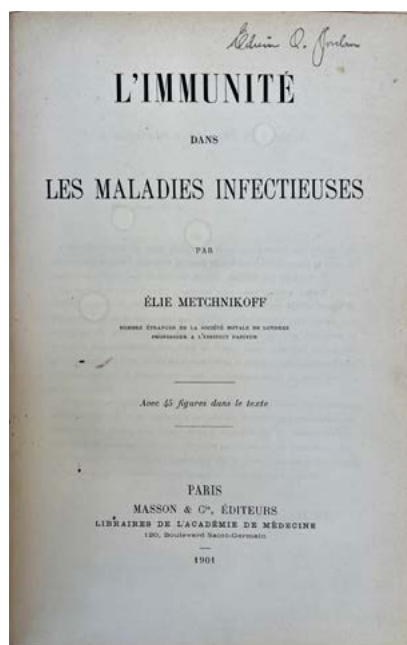
“In 1890, Koch announced the discovery of tuberculin, a substance derived from tubercle bacilli, which he thought was capable of arresting bacterial development in-vitro and in animals. This news gave rise to tremendous hope throughout the world, which was soon replaced by disillusionment when the product turned out to be an ineffective therapeutic agent. In this paper Koch provided his definitive expression of ‘Koch’s Postulates’” (Garrison-Morton.com). (48787)
